Target Group / Addressees	High-school graduates, with upper-intermediate and advanced knowledge of Latin, who desire to acquire skills and knowledge both in Latin language and literature and in Ancient Greek language and literature, in order to be able to teach them in secondary schools and to do research in Documentary and Ancient Books Libraries and Museums.

Description of Study	The curriculum is centred upon consolidating the students' knowledge of Latin and Ancient Greek, both of them being seen as an organic unity, with an emphasis on improving their skills in using these two Classical languages as cultural sources and theoretical foundations that have extensive applications in the various areas connected with the Romance Languages and Romance Linguistics as well as in the field of the Indo-European Comparative Linguistics. In this respect, students are offered a range of practical courses (e.g., Text Interpretation, Composition, Translation, Grammar Exercises and Historical and Comparative Grammar Techniques) and numerous theoretical and elective special courses in Classical Philology, Indo-European Linguistics, Epigraphy, Paleography and Codicology. There is also a wide variety of courses in Greek and Roman Mythology, Religion and History .
Purposes of the Programme	To develop the students' competencies in linguistic and literary studies and prepare them as future teachers and researchers in the field of the Classical Languages and
