Profile of the Degree Programme	Philosophy
Target Group / Addressees	The master's programme is addressed to philosophy, philology, sociology, anthropology, political science, communication science, theology bachelors degree and to bachelors degree of other areas.
Entrance Conditions	The entrance exam consists of the graduation average grade and of writing and defending a proposed research plan. The admission is based on the admission mark, calculated as: the graduation grade point average (50%), research plan (50%).
Further Education Possibilities	The master's programme ensures that the graduates receive a solid grounding to undertake studies in doctoral programs.
Description of Study	This programme is designed as scientific master's programme of research, integrating practical-applicative orientations. Its mission consists of broadening and deepening the philosophical studies, it aims to encourage theoretical and applicative researches in the domain of philosophy, in effectuating philosophical training in various fields of activities in order to provide graduate students a competitive philosophical training in line with the research needs and in response to the demands of the labour market.
Purposes of the Programme	The master's programme is focusing on providing students with abilities and capacities to implement philosophy in three major directions: a.) in interdisciplinary research; b.) in interpreting, understanding and explicating contemporary socio-cultural phenomenons; c.) resolving practical problems at both the individual and collective levels.
Specialization / Area of Expertise	The qualification this master's programme offers: a.) philosopher, philosophy expert, philosophy consultant; b.) scientific researcher in the field of philosophy; c.) philosophy teacher; d) editing expository/scientific texts

	editor, lecturer, translator; e) programme director, mediator.
Extra Peculiarities	The master's programme enables the completion of the 2 nd psycho-pedagogical module; a certificate will be issued which empowers the graduates to teach in high-schools as well.
Practical Training	The practical training performed at the end of the first year of the master's programme consists of: developing and refining the research methodology in philosophy, editing academic papers (essay, article), editing and translating specialized texts, modalities for demonstrating of scientific projects, getting acquainted with the activities of civic organizations and cultural institutions (editorial offices, foundations, associations).

Gained Abilities and Skills	The master's programme enables students to gain the following professional skills and abilities: general philosophical knowledge and acquisition of methods, expertise in the basic research works in philosophy and in researches in applied philosophy, editing, copy-editing, interpreting, translating, publishing of specialized writings, philosophical consultation focusing on resolution of issues regarding understanding, lifestyle and public affairs, planning, organizing and arranging professional programs and filing applications.
