Description of advertised position	<p>The advertised position, as part of the Department's and the Faculty's broader strategy during the past years, is aimed at ensuring continuity in the teaching of English literature (especially the poetry of the 18th century and Romanticism), as well as enhancing research in the field.</p> <p>The candidate for the position of lecturer should hold a PhD in Philology and should have teaching experience. They need to have conducted relevant research in the field of British literature, and to have published papers on themes related to area covered by the subjects mentioned above.</p> <p>The applicant is expected to engage in research projects in the field of British literature, together with colleagues (as well as PhD and MA students) from the department.</p> <p>The candidate should meet all requirements stipulated in the research standards of Babeş-Bolyai University, and should be able to demonstrate proficiency in English for teaching at BA</p>

	level, based on relevant documents and academic teaching experience.
Position requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The teaching load is of 10.5 hours/week. • Teaching courses and seminars to English majors and minors in the 2nd year (BA), in accordance to the subjects specified and listed above. • Research activity carried out in at least one of the subjects included in the fields of expertise required for the advertised position, in conformity with the candidate's career project and the standards of academic excellence of Babeş-Bolyai University and of the Faculty of Letters. This includes the publication of articles and volumes, attending national and international conferences, participating in research grants. • Supervising BA and MA theses, administering admission and graduation exams, various assessment activities, counselling students. • Various administrative activities within the department.

Assessment of candidates' CVs and publication lists, including their professional achievements, counting for 75% of the final grade given by examiner in an individual written review. Assessment of the candidates' research activity will take into consideration both the quality of the publications and the candidates' contributions in relation to the position's teaching load; 2. Open lecture on a topic announced by the examiners, selected from the advertised themes and bibliography, on 1 February 2022, 10 am, via email and the faculty web page. The lecture will be held in English on 3 February 2022, 10 am, in Room Blaga, Wing B, 2nd floor, of the Faculty of Letters, Horea Str. 31, 400202 Cluj-Napoca. The lecture will last for at least 40 minutes, and it will be followed by questions addressed by the members of the examiner board or the audience. The lecture will count for 25% of the final grade given by each examiner in the individual written review.

<p>Description of competition</p>	<p>The applicants’ competences will be assessed on the basis of their CVs and publication lists, and of an open lecture on a subject on a topic announced by the examiners. All information regarding the competition will be published on the site of the Ministry of Education and Research (http://jobs.edu.ro/) as well as on the website of the Faculty of Letters.</p> <p>Part 1 – Assessment of the applicants’ CVs and publication lists, which will make up 75% of the final grade proposed in each examiner’s individual written review. Assessment of the candidates’ research activity will take into consideration both the quality of the publications in relation to the requirements of the field covered by the position’s teaching load, and the concordance between the publications’ topics and the position’s field of expertise. The examining board will consider the applicants’ professional experience in each field of activity included in the position: teaching, research, as well as the</p>

applicants' participation in research grants and research programs, administration and institutional organization.

Part 2 – Open lecture on a theme selected by the examiners from the range of topics published in the call for applications; the lecture will make up 25% of the final grade proposed by each committee member in their individual review. The lecture will be held in English, on **the 3rd of February 2022, 10 am, in Room Blaga, Wing B, 2nd floor, of the Faculty of Letters, Horea Str. 31, 400202 Cluj-Napoca.**

Due to the Covid19 pandemic, the oral examination will be held in compliance with the Babeş-Bolyai University competition methodology and legal provisions at the time.

Candidates will enter in alphabetical order. Each lecture will be at least 40 minutes long, and will be followed by a 15-minute question-and-answer session.
