DECISION

on the start of the 2021-2022 academic year

Given the development of the COVID-19 epidemic and the commitment of Babeş-Bolyai University of Cluj-Napoca (UBB) to high-quality academic activities in a secure environment,

the Administrative Council of Babeş-Bolyai University, reunited in the meeting of 26 July 2021,

DECIDES:

1. In the 2021-2022 academic year, UBB will offer face-to-face instruction in a conventional form of educational delivery to the following student categories:
 - a) students who have been vaccinated against the SARS-CoV-2 virus and 10 days have passed after the completion of the entire immunisation programme;
 - b) students who present a negative RT-PCR test result that is less than 72 hours old;
 - c) students who present a certified negative result of a fast antigen test that is no more than 24 hours old;
 - d) students who are between the 15th and 180th day after being confirmed with SARS-CoV-2 infection.
2. For students who do not fall into the categories indicated in art. 1, the possibility to undertake instructional activities online or through other alternative methods will be provided, subject to the conditions established by each faculty, according to the specialisation profile and available resources.

3. On the request of student representatives, the accommodation of students in residence halls for the 2021-2022 academic year will be available for the categories listed in art. 1 at the maximum capacity allowed by the legal measures enforced at the national level in order to prevent the spread of SARS-CoV-2 infections at that time.
4. In exceptional circumstances, students who are unable to be vaccinated owing to documented health conditions may be accommodated in a special regime and will be able to complete their academic activities online (or through other alternative methods established by the faculty).
5. In this context, exams will be conducted in a conventional way, irrespective of the learning scheme.
6. The actions imposed by this resolution may be reconsidered by the Administrative Council depending on the evolution of the epidemiological situation.
7. This decision is forwarded for consideration to the university senate.
