- 5 Insuring the daily cleaning and disinfection of common areas as per the operational procedure regarding the organisation and activity of cleaning to prevent the spread of SARS-CoV-2 in residencies – dormitories
- 6 Placing special bins for the disposal of used masks, upon the entry into sutdent dormsBeds and desks in student dorms will be placed so that
- students benefit from the maximum distance possible
 7 Rooms will be occupied, as much as possible, by students who are enrolled in the same study programme, in order to limit contact of students from different study programmes
- 8 Raising awareness with posts/posters to limit access of more than two people, in common areas of student dorms
- 9 Movement within the student dorms will be limited and gatherings avoided
- 10 Placing disinfectants upon entry into student dorms
- 11 The mandatory compliance with the norms of hygiene within common areas and in rooms within student dorms – posters will be visible on each floor
- 12 Using cleaning products and virucides/antiviral agents that are approved by the Ministry of Health
- 13 Constantly informing staff on the protection measures against SARS-CoV-2
- 14 Articulating the specific operational procedures regarding the cleaning/disinfection and on the procedure to quarantine/isolate within student dorms
- 15 Daily check-up by the dorm administrator of the daily cleaning and regulate disinfection processes of frequently touched surfaces
- 16 Information on the proper hygiene will be posted on each floor of the student dorm
- 17 People's access and traffic will be managed upon entry into student dorms, by doormen, so that the physical distance of 1,5 m among people be complied with and by complying with the triage protocol
- 18 Instructing the staff in charge with security/surveillance in student dorms on the specific regulations of student dorms operations with the view to preventing/limiting the spread of SARS-CoV-2

| | 7 | Students will be informed on the provisions and obligations to comply with the isolation protocol |
| | 8 | Common areas will be avoided as much as possible, and study activities will take place in each student's bedroom (no warm food is to be cooked in bedrooms) |
| | 9 | Students must maintain cleanliness, disinfect and ventilate their rooms regularly |
| | 10 | Students accommodated in dorms must inform the dorm administrator of their absence from the student dorm during the night |
